A Week at A Glance...12/11/2017 - 12/15/2017

On **Tuesday, December 12, 2017**, our Church will celebrate the **Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe**. This is in remembrance of the apparition of the Blessed Mother to a fifty-seven year old Aztec peasant named **Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin** that began on December 9th. It was the first known apparition to occur in the Americas.

On the morning of December 9,1531, Juan Diego, a widower, who was still mourning the death of his wife, Maria Lucia, was walking near what is now Mexico City (Tepeyac Hill) when he came upon an apparition of a "Maiden" who was dressed in traditional Aztec clothing. He soon came to recognize her as the Virgin Mary, who spoke to him, instructing him to go to the local bishop, Bishop Zummarraga, a Franciscan, to ask that a church be built there in her honor. Juan Diego did what Mary asked of him, but the bishop, who did not understand the Indian dialect very well, did not believe his story. He wanted more evidence. Juan Diego went to Mary with the bishop's request. Mary asked him to return the next day and she would give him a sign.

After his departure from the Blessed Mother, Juan Diego learned that his uncle was gravely ill and wanted to see a priest. The next day, Juan Diego hurried to find a priest for his uncle. He did not return to Tepeyac Hill out of fear that Mary's visit would keep him from finding a priest in time to see his uncle before his death. Mary met Juan as he made his way to find the priest. When he told her the reason he did not meet her on the hill, Mary responded "Am I not your Mother? Are you not under my protection? Do not let your uncle's illness trouble you, because he will not die. He is already well."

Mary instructed Juan Diego to go to the top of Tepeyac Hill. There he discovered beautiful Castilian roses, which were neither in season nor native to the region, growing on the rocky, craggy hillside. Juan Diego gathered as many as he could in his tilma (*a burlap-type cloak*) and brought them to Mary, who arranged them and instructed him to take them to the bishop.

When Juan Diego arrived at the bishop's residence and opened his cloak, the flowers fell to the floor and on the surface of the tilma was the image that has come to be known as "Our Lady of Guadalupe." Mary had spoken to Juan Diego in his native language, *Nahuatl*, and in this same language he gave the bishop further instructions, using her proper name, *Coatlaxopeuh*, (pronounced quatlasupe) for the image. The name means "*The one who crushes the serpent*." The bishop understood the name to be *Guadalupe*, which has a similar sound, and was already the name of a shrine honoring Mary in Spain.

Within seven years, through the miracle of this apparition, nine million Aztecs were converted to the Catholic faith. This was one of the greatest conversions in the shortest period of time in the history of Christianity.

Today, the tilma, made primarily of rough cactus fibers and typically of poor quality, hangs in the basilica built to honor Mary in Mexico City. The silken image imprinted on the tilma by Mary, herself remains undefiled. This defies scientific explanation, as it should have disintegrated centuries

ago. In 1979, scientists analyzed the cloak and discovered that it maintains a constant temperature of 98.6 degrees Fahrenheit, the same as that of a living human. A Mexican doctor also examined the tilma. He concluded that the dimensions of Mary's body in the image were that of an expectant mother due quite soon. Finally, one of the most common attributions lie with in the Blessed Mother's eyes. Tests, using magnification, show, reflected in both eyes, the images of 13 people. This appears to be a snapshot of Juan Diego and the people who were present as he unfurled his tilma before the bishop.

The shrine that was subsequently built on the spot of Mary's apparition, is where the original tilma can still be seen. It remains one of the most popular pilgrimage sites in the world. Our Lady's image on the tilma of Juan Diego, now Saint Juan Diego, remains an on-going sign of her love for her children. *Hail Mary full of Grace...*
