MARCH 19, 2018

Today we celebrate the feast of St. Joseph. This day commemorates the life of St. Joseph, the step-father of Jesus and husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Pope Pius IX proclaimed Saint Joseph the patron of the Universal Church in 1870. Having died in the "arms of Jesus and Mary" according to Catholic tradition, he is considered the model of the pious believer who receives grace at the moment of death, in other words, the patron of a happy death. He is the patron saint or workers, fathers, travelers, unborn children and immigrants.

Next week is the last week of the season of Lent and is at the center of our Catholic faith. We call this "Holy Week" because Jesus' public ministry culminates with His suffering, death and resurrection. During these solemn days, in our minds, hearts and with our whole being, try to prayerfully journey with Jesus, beginning with His entry into Jerusalem, moving forward and pausing to consider each event that took place on those days leading to His crucifixion and death, prior to His glorious resurrection.

Scripture scholars continue to debate the idea that we can follow a day-by-day journal of Jesus' last week. There *are* historical gaps, as well as somewhat different accounts and time frames that don't quite line up. Still, it is a great blessing to consider the Lord's last week and to walk with Him.

Without a Catholic experience like the one I had here, I fear that God may have not had such an impact on my lifestyle as he does today, which is something serious to consider when making a decision about your child's education. We are pleased to announce that thanks to generous funding from the Dias Family Foundation, the Lusitania Institute and LUSO Federal Credit Union, SJB School has invested in "Google Classroom", an interactive educational program that is unique for an elementary school to offer.

Google Chromebooks have been purchased for our faculty who are training now to become proficient in all uses of Google Classroom so that it can be implemented for all of our students in the 2018-2019 school year.

Our students will be provided Google Chromebooks or Tablets by the fall of 2018. With Google Classroom, teachers can set up a digital classroom and be able to share assignments, announcements and questions with students and other teachers. They can create classes, distribute assignments, communicate and stay organized, all in one place. In addition, parents and guardians will be able to receive an email summary of their student's work.

Google Classroom will give our students guided exposure to the digital world and empower them to become highly effective CREATORS of digital content, not just consumers.
