Memorial Day for some families is the unofficial kickoff of summer and all the fun and excitement it brings. To others, **Memorial Day** is a solemn day to honor and remember those who have passed from this life. For families of war veterans, **Memorial Day** carries a special significance. They are mourning the loss of those loved ones who gave their lives in service to our country.

As **Catholics**, let us consider how in scripture and in military service the willingness to give up one's life is not dependent on the worthiness of the people who benefit from the honorable act. The sacrifice of the veteran follows the example of Jesus laying down His life for our freedom. It is a selfless love for others. "We know what real love is because Jesus gave up His life for us. So we ought to give up our lives for our brothers and sisters." I John3:16

On **Memorial Day** while having fun with our families and friends, let us pause a moment to honor and pray for our American soldiers who sacrificed for the freedom we have in our country. May we also give thanks to God for the freedom we have to spend eternity with Him because of His gift of forgiveness through the life, death and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ "Greater love has no one than this that he lay down his life for others" John 15:1.

Last weekend we celebrated Pentecost, 50 days since Easter and "the birthday of the Church". Christ had promised His Apostles that He would send His Holy Spirit and on Pentecost they were granted the gifts of the Spirit. The Apostles began to preach the Gospel in all of the languages that the Jews who were gathered there spoke, and about 3,000 people were converted and baptized that day. This is why Pentecost is often called "the birthday of the Church." On this day, with the descent of the Holy Spirit, Christ's mission is completed, and the New Covenant is inaugurated. It's interesting to note that St. Peter, the first pope, was already the leader and spokesman for the Apostles on Pentecost Sunday (see Acts 2:14ff). One symbol of the Holy Spirit is a dove. There is no mention of a dove in Acts, but we associate a dove with the Holy Spirit because of the story about Jesus' baptism: "After Jesus was baptized, he came up from the water and behold, the heavens were opened [for him], and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove [and] coming upon him" (Matthew 3:16). The color of the vestments worn by priests on Pentecost is red to symbolize the love of the Holy Spirit, or the tongues of fire that appeared over the heads of the apostles on Pentecost. As a family you can read aloud the story of Pentecost in the second chapter of Acts.

REGISTRATION/FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

There is also the McVicar Scholarship. We encourage everyone to apply for this. You can find the application on our website as well.

The Bourbeau Scholarship is also available for those families that have more than one student attending, but is mainly need based.

We are now accepting new applications for students wishing to enroll in the fall of 2018 in Kindergarten through Grade 8. Students should be 5 by September 1st to attend kindergarten. If you would like more information please use our website and/or contact the school.
